Recipe Corner

Corned Beef Dinner

Ingredients

- 1 corned beef brisket (about 5 lbs.)
- 2 med. onion, peeled and quartered
- 4 black peppercorns
- 1 bay leaf
- 1/2 tsp. rosemary, crushed
- 1 qt. water
- 6 med. potatoes, peeled and quartered
- 6 med. carrots, peeled and cut into 2" pieces
- 6 parsnips, peeled and cut into 2" pieces
- 1 cup celery, cut into 2" pieces
- 1 med. head green cabbage, cut into 8 wedges

Place beef in large <u>Dutch oven</u> with tight-fitting lid. Add onion, peppercorns, bay leaf, rosemary and water. Bring to a boil; simmer covered for 3-1/2 hours or until meat is fork tender.

Add potatoes, carrots, parsnips and celery to Dutch oven. Place cabbage on top of meat. Cover and cook for 1 hour or until vegetables are tender.

Remove vegetables and meat to large platter. Serve with mustard or horseradish. Yield: 12 servings
